As we enter the season of Spring, turn our clocks forward an hour, prepare for warmer weather, the return of our snowbirds and tourists; in the midst of these natural preparations, we continue to move forward through the season of Lent as well: preparing ourselves for Holy Week. Lent, in popular culture, has become an occasion for us to give something up for a while, most often, only to take it back up for the rest of the year at the end of our trial period. I would hope that this experiment sheds some light on what such a sacrifice really means, but I do wonder.

Lent is not popular even in the church. It is a tough decision to intentionally be penitential, to focus our attention and spend some time thinking and praying about our own faith. Asking ourselves questions such as: what does Jesus' death mean for me? Where do I need resurrection in my life? How can I grow closer to God?

In the season of Lent, we prepare ourselves for the tremendous loss of Jesus who was put to death at the hands of those who did not understand him or feared him; we prepare for the time afterward when we did not know where to turn or how to be who Jesus asked us to be after his death; and we prepare for the joy of resurrection on Easter. These are significant emotional changes that most of society would rather avoid, and do so. The special worship services where we get in touch with these feelings are traditionally lightly attended, while the relief, the joy, the celebration of Easter is quite popular.

I would invite you to arrange your schedule this month to attend either the Maundy Thursday worship service on April 21 or the Good Friday worship on April 22 both at 7pm. Each service is a powerful reminder of why we recognize the events of Holy Week. After we spend some time identifying with the disciples, Jesus' mother, and the countless followers from Palm Sunday that were in hiding after the crucifixion, we will then join the women who went to the tomb seeking to honor Jesus as we attend either our outdoor Easter sunrise service at 8am or our traditional 10:30 Easter worship. May the peace of Christ be with you.

Please note that the church office will be closed and staff will have Monday, April 25 off in recognition of the extra work of Holy Week.

## **Special Offering to Strengthen the Church**

On BIG Sunday, April 3, in addition to Bringing In Groceries that will be donated to Benzie Area Christian Neighbors, in addition to celebrating communion, and in addition to celebrating the April birthdays and anniversaries of our members and friends, we will also collect a special offering called "Strengthen the Church." This is a special offering of the United Church of Christ that supports new churches.

When we think of church budgets, we most often think about building upkeep, personnel, and program spending, but if you belong to a church that has only been in existence for a few years, you probably do not have your own building, you may not be able to afford a pastor, and programs must be led by volunteers and donations. Worship in new churches tend to use recorded music rather than live musicians. All of these circumstances make it difficult for new churches to get off the ground or even build a strong foundation. And so, on BIG Sunday in April we will collect a special offering to support new church starts locally and across the nation, to help others discover that God is Still Speaking.

Good Friday evening service in our sanctuary is at 7:00 p.m.



**Between Friends...** Debbie Macomber traces the lives and friendship of Jillian and Lesley through their letters, diaries, newspaper clippings, even school essays. Born in 1948 in the same Washington state town, the girls become fast friends in spite of their vastly different backgrounds. This friendship is to span 50 years. Because of its scrapbook-style, this story doesn't read as smoothly as other Macomber works, but if you're a fan, you will give it a chance.

Help, Lord! I'm Having a Senior Moment...Again! Seniors (and even seniors-to-be) needing a laugh will enjoy this book which is written as a collection of prayers to God about s person's senior moments...the take-out lunch that can't be found only to be found later in the closet on the hook with the car keys!
