

A JOYFUL NOISE!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! The wonder of Easter is upon us. We celebrate together the victory Christ has won over death. New life is available for us all. Not unlike the fact that Spring is on the way. What a wonderful winter we had (if you like snow!) but warmth and sunshine, fresh breezes, and new life sounds so very nice, just as nice as the new life we find as Christians at Easter.

As promised, I will continue to share for several months what I am learning through my CoachShare program where I am working with a nationally trained Coach along with several other UCC pastors across the country to help our churches become revitalized. We begin by setting goals. I have shared in worship that my number 1 goal for 2013 is to shift the focus of our congregation from inside the walls to outside and into our community by using mission to redefine our identity. To help us achieve this goal, I have set the first tangible goal of our congregation donating ten children's books per month to Crystal Lake Elementary school. As we continue to donate books to the school and as we continue to send more church members across the street to volunteer with these children, the community will begin to recognize us as a spiritual organization who cares about education and children in our neighborhood.

This tangible goal is supported by the first three key characteristics of spiritually vital congregations. I have mentioned before that 1) people who do not attend church regularly are not interested in just hearing about God, they want to experience God; and 2) churches need to be connected to their local neighborhood in a meaningful and relevant manner. The third key characteristic of a spiritually vital congregation is to have a clearly defined and visible path for spiritual growth (how to get connected with God and grow in Christ-likeness).

The easiest way for us to foster connection to God is through our weekly worship service, but one hour per week is not enough for us to be spiritually vital. So we offer Bible studies frequently. It is my hope this year that more church members will participate in our Bible studies to help us strengthen our faith. The Lenten gatherings were wonderful ways for us to grow deeper in community and faith. This year we are adding the creation of a relationship between our church and Crystal Lake Elementary school. This will help us create a new identity in our community and help us as a congregation to grow in Christ-likeness.

I had the opportunity to spend some time in a local courtroom recently. Though I was not there long, I witnessed great emotional distress among those who found themselves standing before a judge who would decide their fate. It made me realize that being Christian is so much more than what we do in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings at 10:30am. Our community needs us to pay attention to them and to share the good news of new life that we know in our hearts. Let us start with children's books, Bible studies, and worship this year as we begin to grow into a more spiritually vital congregation.
