Hi,

Over the past five months I have offered up poetry for contemplation. This month I would like to offer a different perspective, a place for you to practice some writing. Before you cringe as badly as I do in thinking about writing a haiku, here is the premise.

This past week I attended the online space of the Festival of Homiletics. One of the speakers was Rev. Dr. Otis Moss III, the preacher and teacher of Trinity UCC, Chicago. Dr. Moss is a vibrant and energetic motivator, teacher, and preacher. His lecture was based on the question: Do we retell or tell anew the story of God and/or Jesus? Do we simply tell the story that we know over and over again, or do we find innovative and thought-provoking ways to share the story of Jesus? Towards the end of the lecture Dr. Moss gave a writing assignment, a challenge. To write your favorite biblical story with out using the letters <u>a</u> or <u>e</u>. Here is one of mine, Exodus 3:1-12, Moses and the burning bush.

Moses loom up to it and understood spirits singing, "Doff your flipflops, for you occupy holy ground. I am God, God of your blood, of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. I know my individuals cry and now you must go on a mission, to go to the Pharoh and notify him to let my individual go." Moses blurted, "Who am I to do this work??" And God said, "I will be with you."

Personally, I think that I would fail this assignment should I have had to complete it at seminary. Dr. Moss also stressed finding another way to tell the story. How would you react if you had some strange things happen to you? Let's paint a scene.

You now find yourself running from the law because you stood up to the powers that be to protect someone, and those said powers are now trying to kill you. You find this wonderful woman, who is not the one society says that you are to marry, but you do anyways. Life is fairly good. Your father-in-law has given you full reign over watching some of his sheep. Nice. You are away from people and that suits you just fine. Outside all day - Yeah! And then one day you see a bush that is burning. This is not so good. Fire will destroy the grassland, and then the sheep will have nothing to eat. 




